Funding received: £17,350

Background:

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the September 2021 to August 2022. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make an impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

During the academic year September 2021 to August 2022 we plan to spend our funding in the following areas:

£ 8,650 Provision of qualified sports coach for one day a week to teach all classes in the school and to provide targeted extra-curricular sports activity

£6,790 Provision of before and after school sports clubs 5 days a week

£1,880 Competitions and transport
